




## **Unpacking Instructions**

Immediately upon receiving this product, carefully unpack the carton and check the contents to ensure that all parts are present, and have been received in good condition. Notify the dealer immediately and retain packing material for inspection if any parts appear damaged from shipping or the carton itself shows signs of mishandling. Save the carton and all packing materials. In the event that a device must be returned to the factory, it is important that the device be returned in the original factory box and packing.

# Safety Instructions

Every person involved with the installation, operation and maintenance of this device has to:

- be qualified
- follow the instructions of this manual



CAUTION! Be careful with your operations. With a dangerous voltage you can suffer a dangerous electric shock when touching the wires!



Before the initial start-up, please make sure that there is no damage caused by transportation. Should there be any, consult your dealer and do not use the device.

To maintain perfect condition and to ensure a safe operation, it is absolutely necessary for the user to follow the safety instructions and warning notes written in this manual.

Please consider that damages caused by manual modifications to the device are not subject to warranty.

This device contains no user-serviceable parts. Refer servicing to qualified technicians only.



#### **IMPORTANT:**

The manufacturer will not accept liability for any resulting damages caused by the non-observance of this manual or any unauthorized modification to the device.

- Never let the power cord come into contact with other cables! Handle the power cord and all connections with the mains with particular caution!
- Never remove warning or informative labels from the device.
- Never use anything to cover the ground contact.
- Never run the device without lamp!
- Never leave any cables lying around.
- Never look directly into the light source.
- Never use the device during thunderstorms, unplug the device immediately.
- Do not insert objects into air vents.
- Do not open the device and do not modify the device.
- Do not connect this device to a dimmer pack.
- Do not shake the device. Avoid brute force when installing or operating the device.
- Do not switch the device on and off in short intervals, as this would reduce the system's life.
- Do not touch the device's housing bare-handed during its operation (housing becomes very hot).
- Only use device indoors, avoid contact with water or other liquids.
- Only operate the device after having checked that the housing is firmly closed and all screws are tightly fastened.
- Only operate the device after having familiarized with its functions.
- Avoid flames and do not put close to flammable liquids or gases.
- Always replace the lamp, when it is damaged or deformed due to the heat.
- Always keep case closed while operating.
- Always allow free air space of at least 2 m around the device for ventilation.
- Always disconnect power from the mains, when device is not used or before cleaning! Only handle the power cord by the plug. Never pull out the plug by tugging the power cord.
- Make sure that the device is not exposed to extreme heat, moisture or dust.
- Make sure that the available voltage is not higher than stated on the rear panel.
- Make sure that the power cord is never crimped or damaged. Check the device and the power cord from time to time.
- If one of the lamps is obviously damaged, it has to be replaced, so that its functions are not impaired, due to cracks or deep scratches.
- If the external cable is damaged, it has to be replaced by a qualified technician.
- If device is dropped or struck, disconnect mains power supply immediately. Have a qualified engineer inspect for safety before operating.
- If the device has been exposed to drastic temperature fluctuation (e.g. after transportation), do not switch it on immediately. The arising condensation water might damage your device. Leave the device switched off until it has reached room temperature.
- If your Showtec device fails to work properly, discontinue use immediately. Pack the device securely (preferably in the original packing material), and return it to your Showtec dealer for service.
- For adult use only. The device must be installed out of the reach of children. Never leave the device running unattended.
- The user is responsible for correct positioning and operating of the Stage Blinder 4. The manufacturer will not accept liability for damages caused by the misuse or incorrect installation of this device.
- This device falls under protection class I. Therefore it is essential to connect the yellow/green conductor to earth.
- For replacement use lamps and fuses of same type and rating only.
- Allow time to cool down, before replacing lamp.
- Repairs, servicing and electric connection must be carried out by a qualified technician.
- WARRANTY: Till one year after date of purchase.

## **Operating Determinations**

- This device is not designed for permanent operation. Consistent operation breaks will ensure that the device will serve you for a long time without defects.
- The minimum distance between light output and the illuminated surface must be bigger than 2 meters.
- The maximum ambient temperature ta = 40 °C must never be exceeded.
- The relative humidity must not exceed 50 % with an ambient temperature of 40 °C.
- If this device is operated in any other way than the one described in this manual, the product may suffer damages and the warranty becomes void.
- Any other operation may lead to dangers like short-circuit, burns, electric shock, crash etc.

## Rigging

Please follow the European and national guidelines concerning rigging, trussing and all other safety issues.

#### Do not attempt the installation yourself!


Always have the inspections carried out by an authorized dealer!

## Procedure:

- If the Stage Blinder is lowered from the ceiling or high joists, professional trussing systems have to be used.
- Use a clamp to mount the Stage Blinder, with the mounting bracket, to the trussing system.
- The Stage Blinder must never be fixed swinging freely in the room.
- The installation must always be secured with a safety attachment, e.g. an appropriate safety net or safety cable.
- When rigging, derigging or servicing the Stage Blinder, always make sure, that the area below the installation site is secured and that there are not any unauthorized people around.

Improper installation can cause serious injuries and/or damage of property!





The Stage Blinder can be placed on a flat stage floor or mounted to any kind of truss with a clamp.

#### Connection with the mains

Connect the device to the mains with the power-plug. Always check if the right color cable is connected to the right place.

# 🛕 Return Procedure 🖌

Returned merchandise must be sent prepaid and in the original packing, call tags will not be issued. Package must be clearly labeled with a Return Authorization Number (RMA number). Products returned without an RMA number will be refused. Highlite will not accept the returned goods or any responsibility. Be prepared to provide the model number, serial number and a brief description of the cause for the return. Be sure to properly pack device, any shipping damage resulting from inadequate packaging is the customer's responsibility. Highlite reserves the right to use its own discretion to repair or replace product(s). As a suggestion, proper UPS packing or double-boxing is always a safe method to use.

#### Claims

The client has the obligation to check the delivered goods immediately upon delivery for any shortcomings and/or visible defects, or perform this check after our announcement that the goods are at their disposal. Damage incurred in shipping is the responsibility of the shipper; therefore the damage must be reported to the carrier upon receipt of merchandise.

It is the customer's responsibility to notify and submit claims with the shipper in the event that a device is damaged due to shipping. Transportation damage has to be reported to us within one day after receipt of the delivery.





# Installation

Remove all packing materials from the Showtec Stage Blinder 4 Black DMX Bulb. Check if all foam and plastic padding is removed. Connect all cables.

Do not supply power before the whole system is set up and connected properly. Always disconnect from electric mains power supply before cleaning or servicing. Damages caused by non-observance are not subject to warranty.

#### Installing the Lamp

The Stage Blinder 4 Black DMX Bulb uses the Par 36 120V 650W DWE Showgear (ordercode: 80170) bulb as manufactured by all popular manufacturers. Use only the appropriate lamp for your device. Note that, product versions that use other lamps, may be offered in the future. Check your product specification label for information.

#### Always disconnect from electric mains power supply before changing lamps.


The lamp has to be replaced when it is damaged or deformed due to the heat.

**Do not install lamps with higher wattage**! Lamps with higher wattage generate temperatures the device was not designed for.

#### Damages caused by non-observance are not subject to warranty.

#### Procedure

- 01) Pull the 2 fixation screws on the front of the lamp housing (Fig. 03).
- 02) Gently remove the metal lamp cover (Fig. 04).
- 03) Read lamp instructions. Do not touch the lamp bulb glass. Gently remove the lamp from its socket.
- 04) Unscrew the 2 cables on the back of the lamp and remove the lamp. Oil on hands shortens the lamp life. (If you touch the bulb glass, wipe off the glass with a clean, lint-free towel and rubbing alcohol.)
- 05) Take the new lamp out of the box (Fig. 05).
- 06) Take the 2 cables and by using the screws, fit them to the back of the lamp. Put the lamp in the housing (Fig. 06).
- 07) Put the metal lamp housing back and fasten the 2 fixation screws.








# Set Up and Operation

Follow the directions below, as they pertain to your preferred operation mode.

Before plugging the device in, always make sure that the power supply matches the product

specification voltage. Do not attempt to operate a 120 V specification product on 230 V power, or vice versa.

Connect the device to the main power supply.


# **Control Modes**

There are 3 modes:

- Auto mode
- Manual mode
- DMX-512 (2CH)

#### One Stage Blinder (Auto Mode)

- 01) Fasten the effect light to a firm trussing. Leave at least 0,5 meter on all sides for air circulation.
- 02) Always use a safety cable (ordercode 70140 / 70141).
- 03) Plug the end of the electric mains power cord into a proper electric power supply socket.
- 04) When the Stage Blinder is not connected with a DMX cable, it functions as a stand-alone device.
- 05) To activate Auto mode, flip DIP switch #9 to OFF and DIP switch #10 to ON.



Auto Mode: DIP switch #9 to OFF / DIP switch # 10 to ON.

06) Flip DIP switches # 1–8 to set the fade speed: DIP switch #1 ON = fastest fade speed DIP switch #8 ON = slowest fade speed

#### One Stage Blinder (Manual Mode)

- 01) Fasten the effect light to a firm trussing. Leave at least 0,5 meter on all sides for air circulation.
- 02) Always use a safety cable (ordercode 70140 / 70141).
- 03) Plug the end of the electric mains power cord into a proper electric power supply socket.
- 04) When the Stage Blinder is not connected with a DMX cable, it functions as a stand-alone device.
- 05) To activate the Manual mode, flip DIP switches #9-10 to ON.




Manual Mode: DIP switches #9-10 to ON.

- 06) Flip DIP switches #5–8 to set the dimmer intensity, from dark to brightest: DIP switch #5 ON = darkest DIP switch #8 ON = brightest
- 07) If DIP switches #5-8 are all set to OFF, the lamps will be OFF.
- 08) DIP switches #1-4 are not functional in Manual Mode.

#### Multiple Stage Blinders (DMX control)

- 01) Fasten the effect light to a firm trussing. Leave at least 0,5 meter on all sides for air circulation.
- 02) Always use a safety cable (ordercode 70140 / 70141).
- 03) Use a 3-pin XLR cable to connect the Stage Blinder and other devices.
- 04) Flip DIP switch #10 to OFF.
- 05) Flip DIP switches #1–9 to set the desired DMX address.



- 06) Link the devices as shown in Fig. 07. Connect the first device's DMX "out" socket with the second device's "in" socket, using a DMX signal cable. Repeat this process to link the second, third, and fourth devices.
- 07) Supply electric power: Plug electric mains power cords into proper electric power supply sockets, starting with the first device. Do not supply power before the whole system is set up and connected properly.

#### Multiple Stage Blinders DMX Set Up



#### **DIP Switch Setting for DMX Mode**

DMX products must have their own "address" to receive DMX signals. Addresses on the controller are set by flipping the appropriate DMX DIP switches #1-9.

DMX address settings are the sum of the DIP switch values. A standard DMX address for the Showtec Stage Blinder is as follows:

#### Example 1

<b>Stage Blinder</b>	Address Value	DMX DIP Switches ON
Device 5	9	#1, #4
Switch #1 #4 Total sum:	Value 1 <u>8+</u> 9	V1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10 ON

Explanation: Since each device has 2 channels, each address advances by 2 values (See Address Value above). Once address values are determined, add DMX DIP switch values to obtain the appropriate address (DMX DIP switches "ON") for each device. Flip the appropriate DIP switches on each device.

#### Example:

- 01) If you want to give a Stage Blinder a DMX address of 133, you first have to find the number 133 in the DMX Chart.
- 02) Then look at the left side (DIP Switches #1-5) horizontally from 133. In the table you will see #1=ON, #2=OFF, #3=ON, #4=OFF, #5=OFF.
- 03) Finally, look at the upper side of the table (DIP Switches #6–9) vertically from 133. In the table you will see #6=OFF, #7=OFF, #8=ON, #9=OFF.

#### **Device Linking**

You will need a serial data link to run light shows of one or more devices using a DMX-512 controller or to run synchronized shows of two or more devices set to a master/slave operating mode. The combined number of channels required by all the devices on a serial data link determines the number of devices the data link can support.

Important:

Devices on a serial data link must be daisy-chained in a single line. To comply with the EIA-485 standard, no more than 30 devices should be connected on one data link.
 Connecting more than 30 devices on one serial data link without the use of a DMX optically isolated splitter may result in deterioration of the digital DMX signal.
 Maximum recommended DMX data link distance: 100 meters

#### **Data Cabling**


To link devices together, you must obtain data cables. You can purchase DAP Audio certified DMX cables directly from a dealer/distributor or construct your own cable. If you choose to create your own cable, please use data-grade cables that can carry a high quality signal and are less prone to electromagnetic interference.

# Maintenance

The operator has to make sure that safety-related and machine-technical installations are to be inspected by an expert after every year in the course of an acceptance test. The operator has to make sure that safety-related and machine-technical installations are to be inspected by a skilled person once a year.

The following points have to be considered during the inspection:

- 01) All screws used for installing the device or parts of the device have to be tightly connected and must not be corroded.
- 02) There may not be any deformations on housings, fixations and installation spots.
- 03) Mechanically moving parts like axles, eyes and others may not show any traces of wearing.
- 04) The electric power supply cables must not show any damages or material fatigue.

The Stage Blinder requires almost no maintenance. However, you should keep the device clean. Otherwise, the device's light output will be significantly reduced. Disconnect the mains power supply, and then wipe the cover with a damp cloth. Do not immerse in liquid. Wipe lamps clean with glass cleaner and a soft cloth. Do not use alcohol or solvents.

The lamps will require weekly cleaning, as smoke-fluid tends to build up residues, reducing the light output very quickly.

Please clean internal components once a year with a light brush and vacuum cleaner. Keep connections clean. Disconnect electric power, and then wipe the DMX connections with a damp cloth. Make sure connections are thoroughly dry before linking equipment or supplying electric power.

#### Changing the Lamp

- 01) Disconnect mains power supply. Pull the 2 fixation screws on the front of the housing.
- 02) Follow directions for installing a new lamp, page 9.

#### **Replacing the Fuse**

- You do not have to replace the fuse on this device as the fuse is automatic.
- 01) In case of a power surge, short-circuit or inappropriate power supply, press the reset button located on the rear of the device, and the device will function normally.
- 02) Try to determine the cause of the problem, so that the situation does not happen in the future.

# Troubleshooting

This troubleshooting guide is meant to help solve simple problems. If a problem occurs, carry out the steps below in sequence until a solution is found. Once the device operates properly, do not carry out following steps.

#### No Light

If the light effect does not operate properly, refer servicing to a technician.

- Suspect three potential problem areas as: the power supply, the lamp, the fuse.
- 01) Power supply. Check if the device is plugged into an appropriate power supply.
- 02) The lamp. Replace the lamp. See page 9 for more information.
- 03) The fuse. Check the fuse. See page 15 for replacing the fuse.
- 04) If all of the above appears to be O.K., plug the device in again.
- 05) If you are unable to determine the cause of the problem, do not open the Stage Blinder, as this may damage the device and the warranty will become void.
- 06) Return the device to your Showtec dealer.



#### No Response to DMX

Suspect the DMX cable or connectors, a controller malfunction, a light effect DMX card malfunction.

- 01) Check the DMX setting. Make sure that DMX addresses are correct.
- 02) Check the DMX cable: Unplug the device; change the DMX cable; then reconnect to electrical power. Try your DMX control again.
- 03) Determine whether the controller or light effect is at fault. Does the controller operate properly with other DMX products? If not, take the controller in for repair. If so, take the DMX cable and the light effect to a qualified technician.


